WHY CHOOSE HUNTERDON COUNTY YMCA DAY CAMPS

1. OUR EXPERIENCE! The Hunterdon County YMCA has been serving youth in our county for over 100 years. Camp Carr alone has been operating day camping for over 40 years. Many of our staff were campers themselves at Hunterdon County YMCA Camps. They offer a unique understanding of camper emotions, self esteem and successes at camp.



2. OUR SAFETY & SUPERVISION: All staff go through an extremely thorough professional background check process along with 3 reference checks. They all attend extensive training that includes everything from child development training and interactions to team building games. All staff attends a child abuse prevention seminar and water safety class.

4. OUR GROUP COUNSELORS:

- Head Counselors are the leaders and planners for each group. They are adult college students, parents, and/or teachers. Each head counselor is first aid and CPR certified.
- Counselors are the support staff to the head counselors. They consist of college students, parents, teachers and high school students 17 years old and up.
- Assistant Counselors are the group support staff. They consist of college student and high school students 15 years old and up.

6. OUR VALUES: The YMCA incorporates four core values of CARING, HONESTY, RESPECT, and RESPONSIBILITY in everything we do from hiring quality staff to interaction with campers and parents.

CAMP FACILITIES



CAMP CARR: Located in Clinton Township along the south branch of the Raritan River. Camp Carr has a refreshing outdoor pool, 2 large pavilions (one with restrooms for boys and girls) and several Yurts which serve as group bases for campers. (check out this cool web site to see what a yurt is www.yurt.com) Camp Carr is the perfect setting for the child that loves the outdoors and experiencing nature and the environment.



SPORTS CAMP: Sports Camp is located at the YMCA Deer Path Branch about 2 miles north of the Hunterdon Medical Center on West Woodschurch Road off Route 31. This camp has several playing fields that allow multiple sports to be going on at one time. The Deer Path Branch also has an indoor pool, an air conditioned gym, and several multi-purpose rooms.



SOUTH CAMP: Located at the West Amwell ESC School on Route 179. The ESC School generously allows us to use their air conditioned gymnasium, cafeteria, and several classrooms. At this camp twice a week the campers go to Nockamixon Pool in P.A. for the day. Nockamixon is a beautiful State Park where campers get to enjoy both swimming and the great outdoors.



KINDER CAMP: Located at the YMCA Round Valley Branch on Route 22 West. This camp offers little campers the opportunity to enjoy both the outdoors on our small playing field and the indoors in our recently renovated and air conditioned multi-purpose space.

ENERGY, MAGNETIC FORCES & TRANSPORTATION

July 28 - Aug 1

Faster than a speeding bullet - more powerful than a locomotive - this camp is made for Super-Campers! Jump aboard the energy express and travel through time to discover the science behind power and motion. This journey will include in-class experiments such as a water powered turbine illuminating a light bulb, fuel cells cars demonstrating efficiency, and the combined power of electricity and magnetism to create the world's simplest motor. Children will also build their very own electromagnet to take home. Students will discover renewable energy sources, such as the sun and wind, where they will build and test individual solar hot dog cookers and their own balsa wood airplanes. Watch your children light up for this week of Mad Science!

SPACE CAMP: THE FINAL FRONTIER

Throughout the week, brave young astronauts will explore the mysteries of the solar system and the science behind air and space travel. 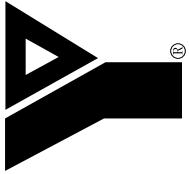
