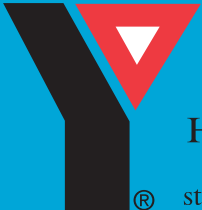

OUR NEED: SUPPORT FOR STRONG KIDS, STRONG FAMILIES AND STRONG COMMUNITIES



As the Hunterdon County YMCA celebrates its second century of uninterrupted service, the enormity of its success is only rivaled by the enormity of its challenge for another century! We continue to play a critical role by further enriching the communities served through the provision of programs and services dedicated to building self-esteem and values, positive family relationships and spiritual, emotional and physical well-being. The YMCA has emerged as the largest provider of child care and youth oriented services in the county and currently has more than 12,000 members, two branches, 18 after school programs and four camp locations serving more than 1 in 8 residents of the county. We currently employ 250 at one time and as many as 500 employees throughout the year. The YMCA has an annual operating budget which exceeds \$8 million largely generated by member/program fees and the generosity of area individuals, corporations and businesses, foundations, clubs and organizations. The YMCA is a 501(c)3 charitable organization and fully provides tax benefits as such allowable by law.

Currently, the Hunterdon County YMCA is awarding nearly \$340,000 in direct financial assistance to more than 2,100 residents throughout the county. In addition to this direct financial assistance, the YMCA subsidizes many significant programs for youth, teens and seniors. Starting in 2008, the Hunterdon County YMCA began offering all county seventh graders a complimentary one-year membership. Seventh grade has proven to be an important time to develop life-long healthy habits. Financial resources and revenue must increase to meet a projected increase in the expectation of future demand for youth, adult and family programs. To help offset some of these costs, the Hunterdon County YMCA once again turns to its community to help ensure that no person is left unserved. The Strong Kids Campaign, with a minimum goal of \$205,000, will enable the continuation of service to all, regardless of a family's financial situation. Over the past five years, the YMCA has distributed more than \$1,000,000 to individuals and families in need.



VISION FOR THE FUTURE

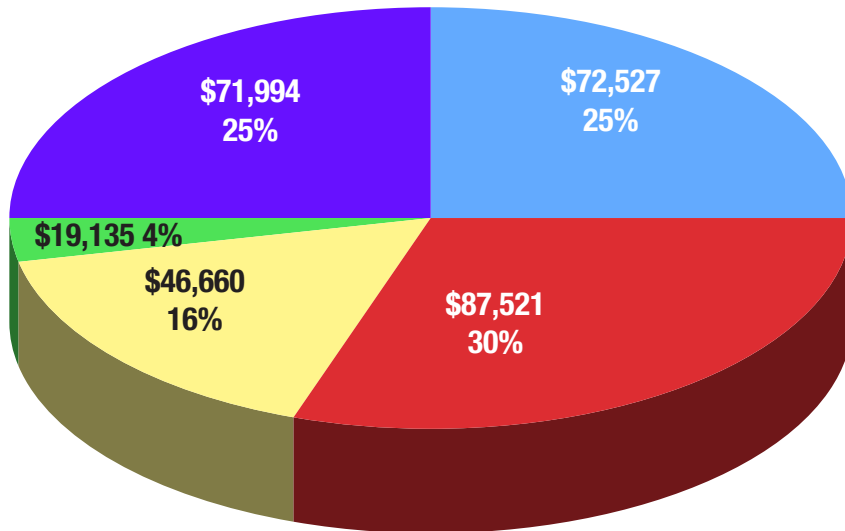

Report on 2009 YMCA Financial Assistance

As of Oct. 30, 2009 local families and individuals in need received \$216,843 in YMCA financial assistance for health and wellness, child care, summer camp, youth sports and aquatics programs. The YMCA supports the efforts of other Hunterdon County non-profits, who received \$71,994 in financial assistance to be able to participate in wholesome YMCA programs and services. Through the generosity of **individuals, local businesses, foundations, corporations** and the United Way giving to the YMCA, **\$288,837** in financial assistance was awarded to date. This is an increase of almost \$32,000 from the previous year.

Youth Sports and Aquatics

Fair play sets the game above the prize. YMCA aquatic programs teach life saving water safety skills to children and adults. Learning to swim can save a life, and the HCYMCA takes this responsibility very seriously.

The Hunterdon County YMCA is pleased to work collaboratively and cooperatively with a number of diverse community agencies and groups.

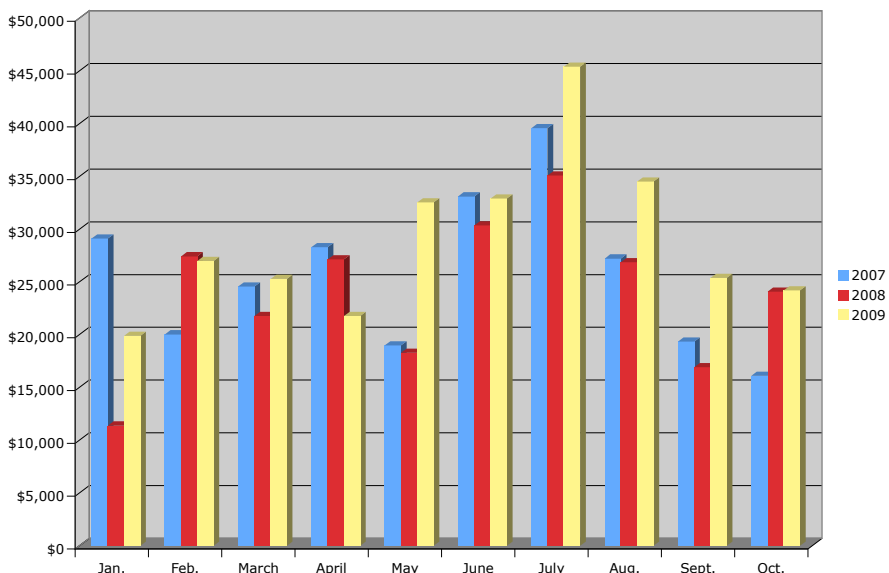
